CHURCH OF ENGLAND: Worship


At St Paul's, we believe in:

- building **Relationships** with others;
- showing **Respect** to and for each other;
- making our faith in Almighty God - Father, Son and Holy Spirit **Relevant** to us and those around us through the way we live - worship and interact with others;
- encouraging others to **Respond** to God's demonstration of love as revealed in the Bible, personified in Jesus Christ and expressed in the Christian faith and community.

Membership of the Church of England is by baptism although, due to its status as the established church, in general anyone may be married, have their children baptised or their funeral in their local parish church, regardless of whether they are baptised or regular church goers.

The Eucharist

In most of Anglican churches, the **Eucharist** is celebrated every Sunday, having replaced Morning Prayer as the principal service. The rites for the Eucharist are found in the various prayer books of Anglican churches. Wine along with wafers or bread are used.



Central to **worship** for Anglicans is the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, also called the Holy Communion, the Lord's Supper or the Mass. In this offering of prayer and praise, the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ are recalled through the proclamation of the word and the celebration of the sacrament. Other important rites, commonly called sacraments, include **confirmation, holy orders, reconciliation, marriage** and **anointing of the sick**.
